Louise Doughty's Whatever You Love (Faber, £12.99), about a woman reeling from the death of her daughter, is a masterful, structurally perfect thriller. Helen Simpson's elegant short stories In-Flight Entertainment (Cape, £14.99) cleverly bring home their serious message, and Polly Samson's Perfect Lives (Virago, £15.99) is a life-enhancing treat of a book, stories too, but strung together cleverly into a novel. I also loved Tim Parks's searingly honest memoir. Teach Us to Sit Still (Harvill Secker, £12.99) about his prostate problems, which unlikely as it sounds, was funny and inspiring.
